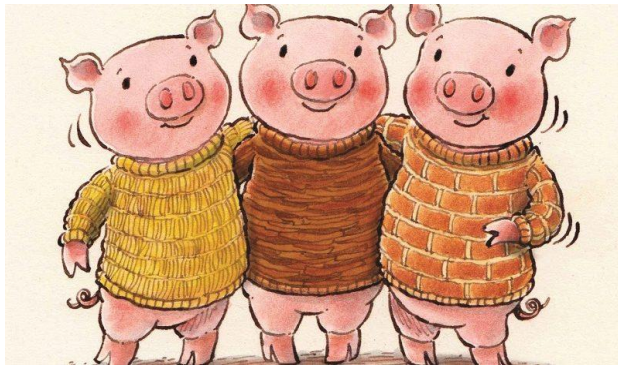
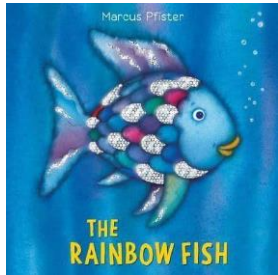

The National Curriculum

This topic will focus on history. The children will learn what life was like as a child in the 1950s. As historians, the children will use primary sources to find out about the past by talking to older generations.

As mathematicians, the children will focus on place value of numbers up to 10 and begin to add and subtract. They will investigate concrete resources such as ten frames and Numicon and link these to pictorial and abstract problems.

As writers, the children will focus on letter formation, using their known sounds and putting finger spaces between words. They will orally retell stories like 'The Three Little Pigs' and 'The Rainbow Fish'. We will also read and explore 'The Colour Monster' focusing on different emotions and feelings that we all have.

As scientists, the children will learn about body parts and how to look after themselves. They will also learn about the 5 senses and begin to work scientifically by creating experiments.

As artists, the children will explore different drawing techniques. As musicians, the children will be focusing on beat and beginning to investigate improvisation.
