As Geographers we will learn the names of the 5 oceans and the 7 continents. We will learn that Kingston is the capital of Jamaica and be able to find it on a map. We will also be comparing Kingston with London's physical and human features alongside their differing climates.

As designers, we will be making smoothies. During these lessons, we will be tasting different smoothies to inform our planning and the designing of our own exotic smoothies.

As scientists, we will learn about how to maintain a healthy body through exercise and good hygiene. We will conduct an experiment to test the effects of exercise on our bodies alongside the importance of a balanced and varied diet.

Shape:

To know the names of a range of 2D and 3D shapes.

To know that a vertex is a corner where edges meet; that vertices are more than one corner (where edges meet).

To know that vertical is a line which runs up and down a page or shape, from top to bottom.

To know that a curved surface is different to a face.

To know that an edge is where faces meet.

To know that a side is a line that joins 2 vertices.

To know that a face is a flat surface on a 3D shape.

Shape: vertex/vertices, parallel, symmetrical, line of symmetry, fold, match, mirror line, reflection, corner (point, pointed), face, side, edge, surface

Money:

To know that there are 100p in £1.
